WASHINGTON– Woolly Mammoth Theatre Company presents the **world premiere** of <u>THE</u> <u>SENSATIONAL SEA MINK-ETTES</u> from February 4 – March 3, 2024. Written by Virginia-born playwright **Vivian J.O. Barnes** and directed by **Taylor Reynolds**, the play follows an HBCU dance team as they prepare for their homecoming performance. The Sensational Sea Mink-ettes are days away from their homecoming performance and the pressure is on. The student body, the administration, the alumni, and their families are all expecting perfection. As the big day creeps closer, the women must contend with flaring tempers and bodies pushed to their limits. Together, they explore what it takes to be a successful and supportive team — all while dealing with some unusual circumstances.

"THE SENSATIONAL SEA MINK-ETTES is our second world premiere this season, and I'm so thrilled to put Vivian's inventive work on the Woolly stage as part of the Weissberg Commissions," says **Maria Manuela Goyanes, Woolly Mammoth Artistic Director**. "I know our audiences have been looking forward to something big, flashy, and fun — but with the kind of off-kilter eye that Woolly is known for — and this is it! *Sea Mink-ettes* is about female friendship, HBCU culture, dance, and even Beyonce. But, it also dives in to the pressure for excellence facing young Black women — and the ways in which our society fails them. The way the play showcases that pressure is surprising, innovative, and wholly unexpected."

The Sensational Sea-Minkettes is the playwright's commissioning piece that secured her a place in Woolly Mammoth Theatre Company's first dedicated commissioning program, which

launched last season. The Weissberg Commissions provides generative artists with the opportunity to innovate and take artistic risks in the creation of new theatrical works. The program allows Woolly Mammoth to support DC-based or born artists and non-local artists writing about topics that directly relate to life in the DMV.

As part of Woolly Mammoth's Connectivity program, students from Howard University will shadow members of the production team and two students will understudy roles.

Developmental support is provided through the Weissberg Commissions funded by the Weissberg Foundation. Vivian J.O. Barnes is a recipient of a Venturous Playwright Fellowship supported by Venturous Theater Fund. The Fellowship was created with the Lark Theatre and is now in partnership with the Playwrights' Center.

ABOUT WEISSBERG COMMISSIONS

In April 2022, the Weissberg Foundation chose Woolly Mammoth Theatre Company for a grant to honor the late Marvin Weissberg, a tremendous philanthropist and theatre lover. The resulting Weissberg Commissions Project is the theatre's first dedicated commissioning program.

Commissions under this new program range from \$5,000 to \$25,000 per project and fund completely new full-length plays, the testing of new ideas, or allowing artists to finish incomplete works. The Weissberg Commissions are given to writers, directors, designers, choreographers, or other generative artists who represent artistic innovation in our field and share Woolly's vision for a socially just world.

In the 2022–2023 season, we have selected and collaborated with Gethsemane Herron, Justin Weaks, Vivian Barnes, and Jenn Kidwell as artists for the Weissberg Commissions.
