From that very first moment, I saw in Woolly a theatre that embodies a legacy that is fearless, and I knew I wanted to be part of the Woolly-verse. As one of the last in the American theatre landscape to maintain a Company of Artists, Woolly's unique relationship to risk and commitment to no holds barred storytelling made it an easy decision to become a Company Member in 2022. Most recently, I had the opportunity to take another leap forward in my artistic journey by debuting as a playwright with A FINE MADNESS this Spring.

With MADNESS, I was not interested in making a play. I was interested in creating a theatrical event intended to smash the wall between spectator and performer. I wanted to revive a "happening", a form of theatre that died out in the 1950's – and I couldn't think of a better place to rediscover an extinct theatrical form than Woolly Mammoth Theatre. A FINE MADNESS began as a way for me to heal and reimagine who I might be. As a member of the first class of Woolly's Weissberg Commissioning Artists, I was given the freedom to discover and develop my voice and vision as a writer and explore my own writing process. I was given the opportunity to conceive a new way of sharing and experiencing stories and the support to see that vision through.

I knew that a New Work like A FINE MADNESS would be a scary endeavor for a theatre to undertake – and I wanted it to be scary. Woolly enthusiastically jumped on board, not with conditions or demands, but with unwavering support for me as a human being and artist, fostering an environment where my creativity and curiosity could flourish. Woolly Mammoth, through special initiatives like **The Weissberg Commissions**, is a leader in the work of nurturing, cultivating, and collaborating with theatremakers in a truly unconditional way.
