ELIZABETH MARVEL* has won four Obie Awards for her Off-Broadway work, most notably for the title role in Ivo Van Hove's 2004 production of *Hedda Gabler*. Most recently, she starred in the Off-Broadway production of Phillip Roth's *Sabbath's Theater*. Of her numerous Broadway roles, she is best known for her portrayal of

Brooke Wyeth in *Other Desert Cities*, a role which she originated off-Broadway. Marvel recently starred in the Apple TV+ limited series HBO Max limited series "Presumed Innocent", "Love and Death" at HBO Max and the Hulu limited series, "The Dropout". Her numerous television credits include Peacock's "Mrs. Davis", Hulu's "Helstrom", Showtime's "Homeland", Netflix's "House of Cards". She can most recently be seen in Blitz Bazawule's adaptation of "The Color Purple" for Warner Bros. Upcoming, she will be seen alongside Viola Davis in the Amazon Prime Video action-thriller film, "G20". Marvel is a graduate of the Juilliard School.

MAYA DAVIS (Associate Director & Creative Line Producer) is a Black biracial NY-based producer and director with a mission to create art that lives at the intersection of social progress and artistic excellence. She is currently the Producer at Williamstown Theatre Festival and an Associate Member of The Wooster Group. Maya has directed and produced in NYC at institutions including National Black Theatre, The Wooster Group, The TEAM, The Public Theater, Playwrights Horizons, The Flea, The Tank, The Drawing Center, and Fordham University, and regionally at Williamstown Theatre Festival and the Warren Miller Performing Arts Center. In addition to her theater work, Maya produces radio plays and films, and she co-creates immersive games and escape rooms.

LEE SUNDAY EVANS~ (Co-Creator & Director) is a two-time Obie Award-winning Director + Choreographer, and the Artistic Director of Waterwell. Most recently, she directed the acclaimed production of Heather Christian's Oratorio for Living Things. In the 2024-2025 season, she is directing Safety not Guaranteed at the BAM Harvey Theater with music by Guster's Ryan Miller and a book by Broadway regular Nick Blaemire, and the world premiere of A Wrinkle in Time with music by Heather Christian and a book by Lauren Yee. MEET FORD + HILL

ANITA HILL (b.1956) is currently a Professor of Social Policy, Law, and Women's, Gender, & Sexuality Studies at Brandeis University. She holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Oklahoma State University and a Juris Doctor degree from Yale Law School. When President George H.W. Bush nominated Clarence Thomas to be the next Associate Justice of the Supreme Court in 1991, Hill testified about the sexual harassment she experienced from Thomas while working with him at the U.S. Department of Education and on the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission. The high visibility of her testimony raised awareness about sexual harassment in the workplace, making her a national figure. Hill has written about gender, racial, and economic issues at length and has received numerous awards, including the American Bar Association's Women Lawyers of Achievement Award and the Louis P. and Evelyn Smith First Amendment Award. She was named as Chair of the Commission on Sexual Harassment and Equality in the Workplace in 2017 and previously chaired the Human Rights Law Committee of the International Bar Association. Her book publications include Speaking Truth to Power (1997), Reimagining Equality: Stories of Gender, Race and Finding Home (2011), and Believing: Our Thirty-Year Journey to End Gender Violence (2021).

DR. CHRISTINE BLASEY FORD (b.1966) is currently a Professor of Psychology at Palo Alto University and a research psychologist at the Stanford University School of Medicine. She holds an undergraduate degree in experimental psychology from the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, a master's degree in clinical psychology from Pepperdine University, a master's degree in epidemiology from Stanford University School of Medicine, and a doctorate degree in educational psychology from The University of Southern California. In 2018 when President Donald Trump nominated Brett Kavanaugh to be the next Associate Justice of

the Supreme Court, Dr. Ford testified that Kavanaugh sexually assaulted her while they were in high school in 1982. In 2018, Time magazine included Dr. Ford on its shortlist for Person of the Year, later naming her as one of the 100 most influential people in Time 100 in 2019. She has received the ACLU's Roger Baldwin Courage Award and in 2019 the Association for Women in Psychology created the Christine Blasey Ford Woman of Courage Award in her honor. She has published widely in her field, including her co-authored book, *How Many Subjects?: Statistical Power Analysis in Research*. Her memoir, *One Way Back: A Memoir*, was released earlier this year.

ABOUT WATERWELL

WATERWELL (Lee Sunday Evans, Artistic Director; Sarah Scafidi, Managing Director; Arian Moayed, co-founder and Board Chair) is a group of artists, educators and producers dedicated to telling engrossing stories in unexpected ways that deliberately wrestle with complex civic questions. We create productions that are creatively daring and emotionally potent to cultivate connections across real and perceived divides. We produce our projects using an evolving set of best practices that are influenced by the principles of community organizing. This is part of an investigation about how storytelling can have the most relevance and impact in efforts to create a more just and humane society.

Waterwell's most recent production was the critically acclaimed world-premiere of Lameece Issaq's A Good Day to Me Not to You at The Connelly Theater in partnership with Plate Spinner Productions, and received a commission from the influential Council on Foreign Relations to create a new site-specific project about Refugees & Resettlement in the United States. Waterwell also commissioned and produced Edafe Okporo's autobiographical play about the six months he spent in immigration detention and put this poignant story in front of legislators in Albany and grassroots audiences around NYC, using theater to build momentum for a current, active Bill that would end immigration detention in New York State through a collaboration with the Dignity Not Detention coalition. In 2019, Waterwell premiered

The Courtroom, a verbatim re-enactment of one woman's deportation proceedings. Called "theater as civic meditation" and named "Best Theater of 2019" by The New York Times, it was performed in active legal spaces, including the seat of the Second Circuit at the Thurgood Marshall Courthouse and then adapted into a feature-length film (thecourtroomfilm.com) that premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival.
